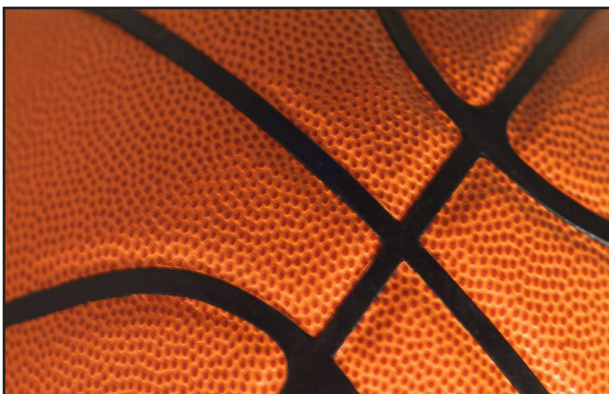

Deadrick's philosophy revolves around focusing on the basics of the game, which includes developing skills in the off-season to enhancing players performances during their seasons. She believes in the fundamentals of the game; a lost art on the youth of the day.

As a player, Coach Deadrick, then Stacy Pelletier, played at St. Scholastica from 1987-1991. She earned NSCAA All-American honors in the 1988-89 season and was an NAIA All-District selection two years in a row. She finished her career at CSS ranked #1 in steals and assists, and was in the top ten in both scoring and rebounding.

Deadrick graduated from CSS in 1991 and went on to earn her M.A. in Athletic Administration from Idaho State in 1994.
